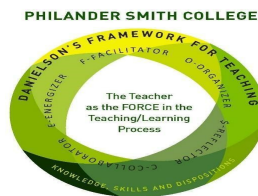


**Measure II. Stakeholder Involvement with the Division of Education at Philander Smith College 2021**

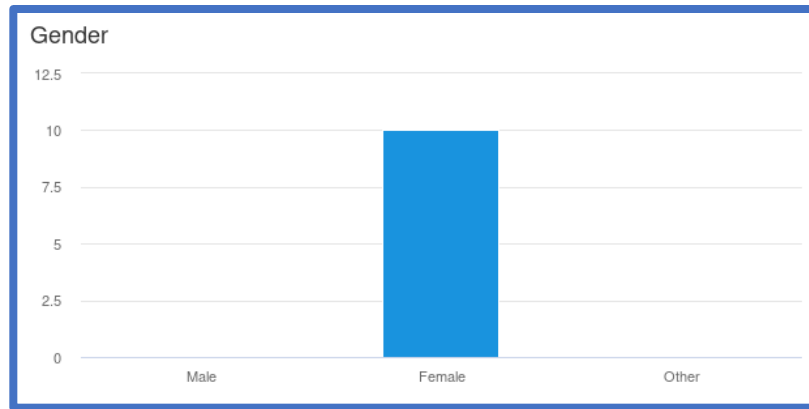


Table B: Ethnicity of Cooperating Teachers

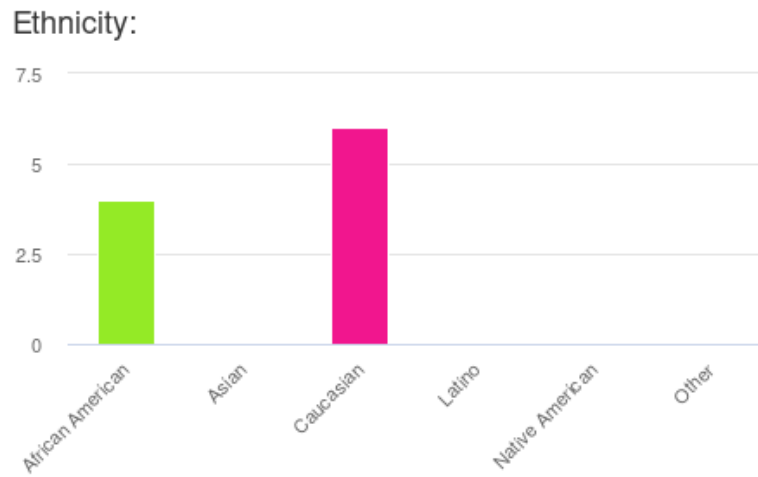


Table C: Years of Teaching Experience

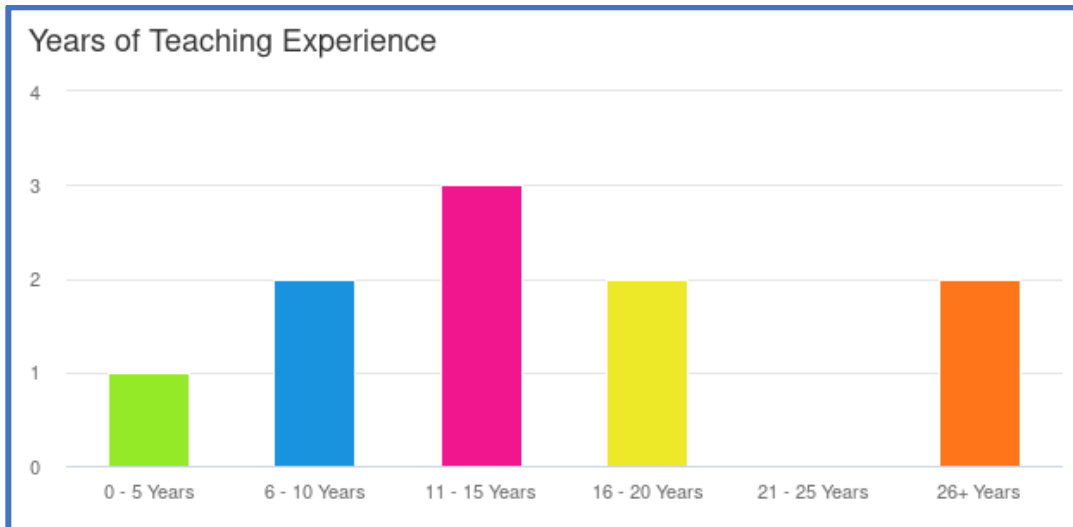


Table D: Grades Taught

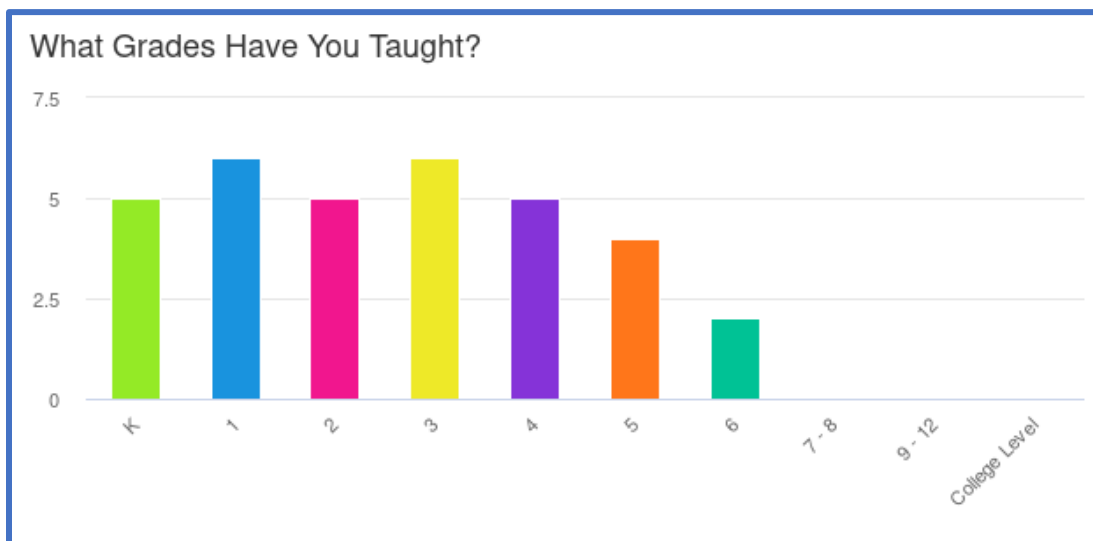


Table E: Percent Nationally Board Certified.

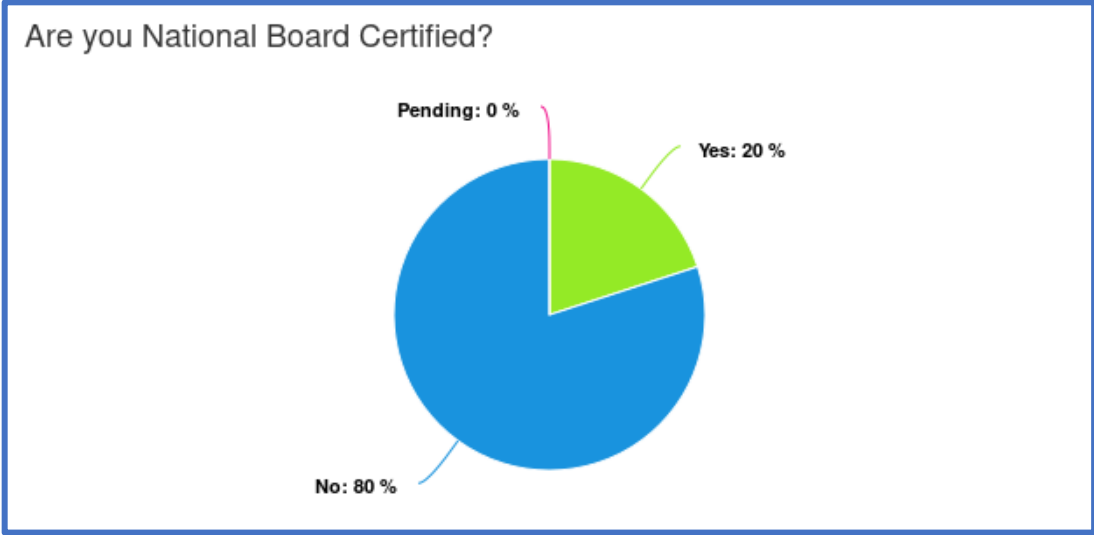
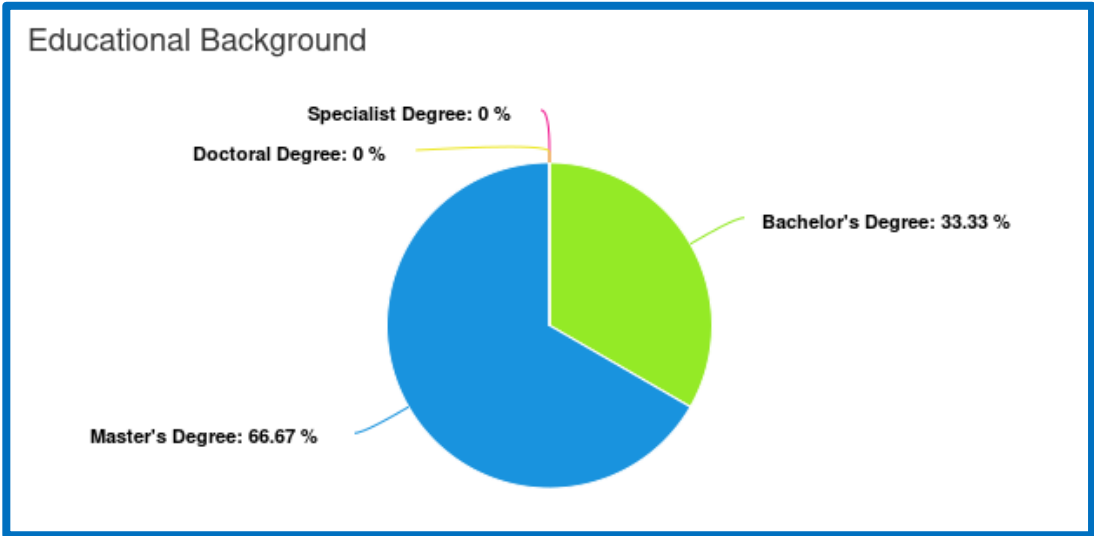


Table F: Educational Background
