Reverend Dr. Charles E. Goodman, Jr



Reverend Dr. Charles E. Goodman, Jr. is celebrating 17 years as the Senior Pastor and Teacher of The Historic Tabernacle Baptist Church in Augusta, Georgia. Under his visionary leadership, the church has grown into "one church in multiple locations," now serving over 15,000 partners. He previously pastored Pleasant View Missionary Baptist Church in Salem, Alabama, for three and a half years.

Dr. Goodman holds an undergraduate degree with honors from Wake Forest University, a Master of Divinity from Emory University's Candler School of Theology, and a Doctor of Ministry from Wesley Theological Seminary. His pursuit of excellence continued with a Master of Management in

> Organizational Leadership from Cambridge College, participation in the Clergy Scholars Program at Yale University, and an Executive Coaching

Certification in Diversity from Howard
University Business School. In 2023, Dr.
Goodman earned a Ph.D. in Leadership from
Anderson University, with research focused
on the Black Church and leadership in times
of crisis. That same year, he was selected as
a Preaching Exemplar in the inaugural
cohort of the Compelling Preaching
Initiative, which fosters African American
preaching through scholarship and
mentorship.

In addition to his pastoral duties, Dr.
Goodman is the author of four books, serves
on various community boards, teaches as an
adjunct professor, and contributes to
numerous ministry publications on
contemporary preaching and ministry
methodologies.

A native of Greensboro, North Carolina, Dr. Goodman is the author of four books. A proud member of Omega Psi Phi and Sigma Pi Phi Fraternities, his inspiring, practical approach to preaching has made him a sought-after speaker, revivalist, and lecturer, sharing the Word of God to empower and uplift people around the world.
